

BRIAN COGBURN

Inducted October 4, 2025



Brian was born and raised in Modesto California where he showed an interest in music at a very young age of 7. He started taking private drum lessons at the age of 8 from a local accomplished jazz drummer until he was about 10 years old. Brian wanted to join the school band at that time but because of a school rule. Brian had to learn a

stringed instrument the first year of school band. Brian chose the violin and within a few months was in private lessons recommended by his school band teacher. For 2 years Brian was classically trained but turned his love of violin music into the fiddle style. Brian grew up playing in Church where he learned his skill and got interested in other styles of music. Brian loved country music and started learn-

ing the fiddle parts from albums like George Straight, Merle Haggard, and Ray Price. It wasn't long before Brian was entering fiddle contests all over California. By the age of 21, Brian had won 3 Northern Regional Champi-



onships, 3 State Championships and was named Fanciest Fiddler in Weiser Idaho at the National Fiddle Championships.

At the age of 17, Brian joined a local band who was opening up shows all over California for artists such



as Merle Haggard, George Jones, Vince Gill and other numerous country artists. At the age of 22, Brian got a call to audition with Curb Recording Artist David Kersh. After his audition, Brian got the call to tour with Kersh and his band for the Fall of 1997

Brian has worked with Johnny Rodriguez, Hank Thompson, The Sons of the San Jouquin and Ty Herndon

Brian is now married with two daughters in college where he runs his own coffee distributing business while living in Oakdale. Brian enjoys playing music locally while spending time with his family.

JIMMY "WAYLAND" BIVENS

Died September 5, 2012, Inducted October 6, 2002



Wayland's music career started at the age of four. His mother Audie placed a fiddle in his hands and he never looked back. He took fiddle and guitar lessons from her.

As a Bandleader he played Clubs, Fairs, Dances and many other venues. He

traveled the world during the Korean War, playing Western Swing and entertaining the troops with the U.S.O. Shows.

After that service, Wayland was a Bandleader and played a few of the "Danceland Clubs" in Odessa and Amarillo, Texas for four years. He also played a stint with the Legendary Bob Wills. Leaving Texas, he moved his family to the Northwest where he played in Lewiston and Clarkston, Idaho for five years at "The Paradise Club" and "The Stables". He then traveled south to the San Diego area where for five years he led and played in "The Westerner", a ten-piece western swing band.

Wayland's next stop found him playing for Billy Mize at the "Foothill Club" in Long Beach. That show lasted nine years.

His last Club job was at Lloyd Hickey's El Rancho in West Sacramento where he played for three years, opening for Tammy Wynette, Buck Owens, Jerry Lee Lewis, Faron Young, Hank Thompson, Hank Snow, Ricky Nelson, and other famous stars. During his career, Wayland ap-



peared at The GRAND OL' OPRY, on the "Traveling HEE HAW Show", and had performances with Little Jimmy Dickens, Webb Pierce, Charley Pride and many, many others.

He finally lived in Kalispell, Montana, where he played for the local church. When western swing bands came through town, Wayland was invited to sit in with the bands for a set or two. Jimmy Bivens passed away on September 5th, 2012, in Kalispell.




