



JOHN STEELE

Born September 11, 1952

Inducted October 3, 2021



John was born on September 11, 1952 in McComb, Mississippi. John's introduction to country and swing music came through his maternal grandmother, an accomplished, self taught pianist and his uncle, a guitar and

fiddle man, who played professionally prior to his service during the Second World War. John was also influenced by his cousin, Miss Tommy Easley who was the lead guitarist for the Louisiana Hayride house band for several seasons and a cousin, Sam Easley, a musician and a recording studio owner in Memphis Tennessee. John's mother, Oneida, a natural singer, encouraged him to use his voice and taught him to sing harmony.

In 1967, the family moved west as John's dad was transferred to Houston. By late 1969, at the age of seventeen John was already known and active in Houston area music circles and was asked to join an eight piece vocal band called the Future Faces. John became the featured baritone vocalist for the group and in the spring of 1970 the "Faces" hit the road full time and toured nationally for Marriott Corporation for the next couple years. In the fall of 1972, John left the group to pursue his own musical interests and his love, country music.

Throughout the seventies John performed full time in the Houston and surrounding areas. In the early eighties he organized a six piece country band and began touring the Texas and gulf coast dance hall circuit. In 1983 John and his band were given the opportunity to open for George Strait. They opened George's southern concert tour dates for two years. John and his band also toured as the opening act for other artists including Johnny Rodriguez, Earl Thomas Conley, T. G. Sheppard and Gary Morris.

In February of 1990 John toured nationally with a country group called the Kikker Band who lived and

William Leon McAuliffe (Jan. 3, 1917 ~ Aug. 20, 1988) was a western swing musician and band leader famous for his steel guitar solos with Bob Wills and The Texas Playboys.

McAuliffe achieved fame as a steel guitarist in the heyday of Western Swing. His now classic tune Steel Guitar Rag inspired Wills to spotlight McAuliffe by calling out, Look out, friends - here's Leon. Take it away, boys, take it away! McAuliffe began playing both Hawaiian and standard guitar at age fourteen. Leon began appearing on a local radio station as part of the group the Waikiki Strummers in 1931. McAuliffe, at age 16, worked with the Light Crust Doughboys, playing both rhythm guitar and steel guitar. In 1935, he joined Bob Wills and the Texas Playboys, who would soon become the premier western swing band in existence. Leon stayed with Wills until World War II. While with Wills he helped compose San Antonio Rose (instrumental version). Leon is more noted, however, for his most famous composition, Steel Guitar Rag and his playing, along with that of Houston's Bob Dunn (Light Crust Doughboys) that popularized the steel guitar in the United States. McAuliffe learned to electronically amplify his guitar from Bob Dunn, who later was a member of Milton Brown's Musical Brownies. During WWII he was a flight instructor in the Army Air force. After the war, McAuliffe returned to Tulsa, Oklahoma

BOARD MEETING MINUTES from August 7, 2022

Meeting called to by order by President Barnes with a quorum at 10:35am.

Approval of Minutes: Via an email vote the Board Meeting Minutes of August 7, 2022 were accepted.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT.

He reported that the hall representative is perhaps not as helpful as anticipated. It appears that since the "jam room" is not rented, the rep is not responsive in making it more accommodating to our usage. Barnes will continue negotiations.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

Swanson distributed the July Income/Expense Report. Moved Reitz, Second Weiss to accept the report.

Approved 5-0.

WEB MASTER'S REPORT.

Reitz indicated the site is running smoothly. McCoy's flyer has been placed on the front page. Some page details are taking time to setup.

NEWSLETTER REPORT.

Elkan complimented Harris on the pictures she has been taking at each dance. He will be out of town for a time, but has a laptop that will enable him to work on the Newsletter while away.

OLD BUSINESS.

Friday Night Dinner/Dance. Barnes indicated that plans are moving forward. A flyer is being designed; A red, white, blue color theme will be used for decorating; Eventbrite will again be used for on-line ticket sales; The caterer is requiring a 3 day in advance confirmation of the number of dinners.

Hall of Fame. Barnes reported that 9 of the 12 inductees will attend the ceremony. The cost for Saturday and Sunday will be \$10 per day. Colored wrist bands will be utilized instead of tickets. Skips Music will have an ad placed on the back cover of the HOF program. Each year he has generously donated a guitar for our raffle/auction. Invitations to local dignitaries have been extended, but all will be attending a local air show at the same time as our Induction Ceremony. It was suggested that Charlie Hull, a distinguished member of our HOF, be contacted to be part of the presentation ceremony.

At present the Saturday band schedule is incomplete but booked for Sunday.

Guest Crouson, who will handle the MC responsibility on Sunday, indicated that he had condensed almost all the biographies.

By-Laws Revision. Weiss distributed a final draft of the By-Laws Revision to the Board and asked their assistance in proofing the document. Once the process is completed the document will be submitted in final form for Board approval.

NEW BUSINESS

Harris suggested that the Board should do something to recognize our volunteers. After a brief discussion, it was decided that a "Volunteer of the Month" be placed in the Newsletter and recognized from the band stand. Gary Blodgett will be the first recipient.

ADJOURNMENT. Moved Weiss, Second Weiss to adjourn. Approved 7-0.

worked out of Lansing, Michigan. The Kikker Band was dubbed “Ambassadors to Country Music” by the Governor of Michigan and was a long established and popular group in the state. He left the group in mid November of that year and moved back to his home in Katy, Texas.

For the past twenty six years John has remained active in the business and in Music Ministry. He has served as Music Minister for Legacy Outfitters, a national men’s ministry organization for the past several years. In 2010 he and his wife Carol joined the All Around Cowboy Church in Sealy, Texas. Their Pastors are Sonny and Gloria Rice. John became the rhythm guitarist and one of the vocalists for The Swingin’ On Band, a group dedicated to Bob Wills music and traditional Western Swing. The group’s core members include Sonny Rice on upright bass, Terry Barnett on lead guitar and vocals, Mary Barnett on vocals and John. Sonny and Terry were both WSMSS, 2018 Hall of Fame inductees. The band performs regularly for area venues, operas, dances, private functions, charitable events and Ministry opportunities.

The Steele family music legacy continues with John’s children and grandchildren. John’s son Stacey is an active full time Classic Country singer in the Houston area, and his three daughters sing like angels and occasionally perform with dad or big brother. His two oldest grandchildren are students of Houston’s High School for the Performing and Visual Arts.

2019 marks the beginning of John’s 50th year as an active professional musician. John was inducted into the Western Swing Music Society of the Southwest Musicians Hall of Fame on July 13, 2019.

(OK) forming his western swing band and releasing a number of recordings, including Panhandle Rag (Columbia 20546) which reached number six in 1949. His signature song was Steel Guitar Rag, a tune he apparently adapted from a combination of Sylvester Weaver's Guitar Rag and part of the Hawaiian song On The Beach At Waikiki. It was inducted into the Grammy Hall of Fame in 2011. McAuliffe soon opened his Cimarron Ballroom in the remodeled Akdar Shrine Mosque in Tulsa, OK. He and his band, Leon McAuliffe and His Cimarron Boys, named for the ballroom, recorded several songs. The group played regularly on a Tulsa radio station and signed a contract with Columbia Records and McAuliffe's instrumental showcase Panhandle Rag became a top-10 hit in 1949. McAuliffe also opened a recording studio, Cimarron Records. During the heyday of western swing music the phrase Take it away Leon, nearly became a household phrase in the south. It was spoken by Bob Wills and referred to Leon McAuliffe, one of the best and most famous steel guitarists in the world. Though McAuliffe is most famous for his association with the Texas Playboys, he also had a respectable solo career. Around mid-1953, he was doing a daily show over the 50,000 watt KVOO in Tulsa, OK from 12:15pm. Leon also appeared on Wednesday nights at 11:00pm as well as Saturday nights at 10:30pm on a show called the Western Dance Parade. Leon and his band also played every Wednesday and Saturday evenings at the Cimarron Ball Room in Tulsa. In 1954 he purchased radio station KAMO in Rogers, Arkansas. In the late 1950s, he appeared on ABC-TV's Jubilee USA and other broadcasts. McAuliffe funded a music program at Rogers State College in Claremore, Oklahoma, paying for a recording studio and office on campus. For several years McAuliffe taught at Will Rogers State College in the Hank Thompson School of Country Music. It was from this studio and office that Junior Brown taught guitar. McAuliffe was always giving to his students, featuring them in his concerts around northeastern Oklahoma. By the 1960s, western swing had fallen out of vogue and McAuliffe began

 only playing locally. Later Starday released some of his work with the Cimarron Boys. Leon also recorded a couple of albums during the '60s for Dot and Capitol. Western swing music was re-popularized due to the work of bands like Asleep At The Wheel and Commander Cody and His Lost Planet Airmen in the early '70s. In 1971 McAuliffe and Wills made a reunion recording with other members of the Texas Playboys and Merle Haggard. After Wills died (1975), McAuliffe participated in a tribute at Fan Fair 1975. Later he would occasionally stage reunions between himself and the Texas Playboys. In 1984, some of his earlier solo work was reissued in Columbia's Historic Edition Series. Leon McAuliffe died after a long illness in Tulsa, OK.

Driving Instructions to MACHINISTS HALL: From Hwy 50, take the Sunrise Blvd. South exit and cross two lights (Folsom Blvd. and Trade Center Drive).
