DAVE STUCKEY

Inducted October 2, 2022\

Dave Stuckey has been in love with the music since he bought his first Bob Wills 78 in college (Twin Guitar Special / Lyla Lou) but didn't get to live that dream until 1997, when he met met Whit Smith & Elana James in a transitional band following Stuckey's run in The Dave & Deke Combo.

That led to his 2000 record "Get A Load of This", recorded in Austin with the cream of the crop (Whit, Elana, Jeremy Wakefield, Lisa Pankratz, Dave Biller, Jake Erwin, etc) flowed by touring the States with the band and a trip to Japan, backed by crack Japanese WS band The Rollin' Rocks.

Other highlights along the way include producing the 2nd Hot Club of Cowtown release Tall Tales in 1999 and, since 2003, drumming in the long running LA-based Western Swing band The Lucky Stars.

He continues to this day with his band Dave Stuckey & The Hoot Owls, who perform regularly in and around Los Angeles (including The Western Swingout festival) and, along with drummer Hal Smith, fronting the 10 piece Pappy & Junior's Western All-Stars, as a special feature of the yearly Redwood Coast Music Festival in Eureka, Ca

In Memphis, 2020 Stuckey took home the Ameripolitan Award in the Male Western Swing category.

ROCKY RAUSCH

Born September 22, 1947 Died April 8, 1992 Inducted October 6, 1991

Place of birth-Flint Hills Kansas. Early music influences were Bob Wills & Johnny Lee. Age of first performance-15, in "Kansas Musical Trail". Left Kansas for Idaho at the age of 17 and has been making his living playing music ever since, almost exclusively as leader of his own group.

He has been involved in radio and TV in addition to his music shows. He had a four hour (6am-10am) disc Jockey show on KRLC in Lewiston Idaho for a number of years where he promoted western swing all the time. He has played all over the Northwest (lodges, fairs, clubs, rodeos, etc.)

He uses the "South Shore Landing" at the Quality Inn in Lewiston as his home base. Side men were Digger Howell, drums and Jimmy Williams, lead guitar.

He was a long time friend and associate of Wade Ray. He worked for Bob Wills in Amarillo in 1953 as leader of the house band at a club Bob owned there.

He used many musicians from the Washington/ Idaho area that are in the Western Swing Society Hall of Fame: Cotton Roberts, Ron Hutchinson, Don Berkshire, Ray Robinson, Ivan Wood and others.

Rocky has been Western Swing's most loyal promoter for years.

At the time of this bio (1991) Rocky was scheduled to appear on "Nashville Now" and the "Grand Ole Opry".



Whoever thought this would happen? I go to Oklahoma for a family reunion and come home with a long-lost family heirloom: my father's saddle!

My family moved from Oklahoma to California in the summer of 1957. My father never really stopped being a cowboy and in the late '60's he joined the Orange County Sheriff's Posse. At that time, he bought a beautiful palomino and outfitted it with a show-worthy saddle and bridle. With all this western finery, he rode as flag bearer in parades and other events.



As the years passed, my family gradually moved back to our stompin' grounds in Oklahoma. Dad passed away in 1990.

In casual conversation at the recent family reunion, my nephew commented that a guy called saying he had a saddle with a plaque on it, engraved with the name *Shannon Barnes*, 1970. That was my dad! My nephew bought the saddle and had it stored in his garage. I had to have it!

Shipping that saddle from Oklahoma to California was so complicated, I think it would have been easier to
