

Inducted October 6, 2024 Born March 6, 1952



Born March 6, 1952, in Cheyenne, Wyoming

Bio: Growing up as a young boy in Cheyenne, Wyoming, there was always music in our house. Neither parent played an instrument, but my Mom always had the radio on. She liked all kinds

of music, but her favorite was the local Westen Swing and Country music station. One of her favorite songs was "Room Full of Roses" by Eddy Howard, later covered by Mickey Gilley. It was my honor to learn and perform this song many times in her memory.

During my school years, I tried to learn the clarinet, but it didn't take. I also tried stringed instruments and keyboards, but that didn't work either. Finally, in 1967. I tried my hand at drums and found they came easily to me.

During this time, I secured an announcer/DJ position with the local Western Swing/Country music radio station. I had two friends who worked in local radio that encouraged my interest. I studied hard, took the tests, and at 15, became one of the youngest Federally licensed radio operators in the country. I made

friends with another employee, Steve Brooks, who had his own band.

I practiced the drums as often as I could and developed some experience, enough to be hired as a drummer by a local band, the Corvals. The bass




player in that band and I meshed well, and we left to start our own group called Nova, playing many places in Southeast Wyoming and Northern Colorado. During this time, I expanded my experience by subbing with groups led by local musicians George Kent, Eddie Hawkins, Ralph Young and Steve Brooks.

Steve had gone to Nashville to record music and was told he needed to tour to support that. His other band members had no interest in touring, so he approached me. He said he liked my technique and

TONY ARANA

Born 1938 Inducted October 1, 2006



Western Swing veteran, Tony Arana was born in Los Angeles in 1938 and began drumming in earnest after leaving the United States Navy in 1960. Learning along with his band mates in The Green Valley Boys, Tony's talents were honed and his love of Country and West-

ern music grew under the care and guidance of Al Workman and others. After seeing Leon McAuliffe and his eight-piece Western Swing Band in Seattle one night, Tony says, "I knew that was the type of music I wanted to play and I played it every chance I got."

Tony got a lot of chances to play the music he loved with Al Workman, Jim Snyder, Vern Plank, Chuck Smith, Tommy Price, Dick Heil and the Barnstormers, Don Berkshire and the Bootleggers, Johnny Clark, Shirley LaBoyne and the Cottonwoods, Gale Thielen, The Anderson Brothers – Merle and Arvid, Bob MacAvoy, Johnny Wakely, and numerous others. Tony has backed up artists such as Tex Williams, Bobby Bare and Bobby Helms. "I couldn't possibly remember all the musicians I worked with," Tony said, "but I'd like to thank them all for having a good time and making great music."

Tony met Steve Vaughn, future founder of the Seattle Western Swing Music Society in the mid 70's when he was playing with the Bootleggers. Steve talked to Tony about his ideas for a Seattle chapter of the Western Swing Music Society (now known as the Northwest Western Swing Music Society, or NWWSMS) designed to promote and preserve the music that the two men loved. Steve spent time with Tony and the Bootleggers and soon the wheels started to turn and Steve's dream came true.

Tony is currently a resident of Reno, Nevada. He is a charter member of the Seattle Western Swing Music Society (now NWWSMS), and was elected Vice

President in 1986. He was inducted into that Society's Pioneers of Western Swing in 2001, and has been a faithful participant in their ongoing festivities every year.

Tony still plays West

offered me a job. He hired a bass player and we left to make a tour of the Midwest.

From 1974 through 1976, the Steve Brooks Show toured Wyoming (Cheyenne, Laramie, Casper, Rock Springs and Jackson), North Dakota (Bowman), South Dakota (Rapid City, Aberdeen and Huron), Nebraska (Ogallala, Kearney, Norfolk and Lexington), Missouri (Kirksville), Kansas (Kansas City), Colorado (Denver, Colorado Springs and Grand Junction) and Nevada (Ely). We recorded and released several records.

During my time in radio and with various bands, I was fortunate to share the stage at times with such notables as Merle Haggard, Tommy Collins, Steve Brooks, Johnny Western, Jim Baughman and Biff Adam.

After 1976, I returned to Cheyenne, gave up bands for a time, and started as a Deputy with the Laramie County Sheriff's Office from 1978 through 1984.

In 1985, I moved to Southern California. I was not playing with bands actively, but I kept up my practicing and sat in with several bands.

In 2009, I relocated to Northern California, where in 2012 I became a drummer/vocalist for the Lincoln Highway Band, voted "Best Band" several years in a row, playing in the Northern California area – many times as the guest band at the Sacramento Western Swing Society's monthly dances.

My time with Lincoln Highway ran from 2012 through 2018 when I took advantage of an opportunity to buy a house in Idaho Falls, Idaho and relocate there.

Driving Instructions to MACHINISTS HALL: From Hwy 50, take the Sunrise Blvd. South exit and cross two lights (Folsom Blvd. and Trade Center Drive). After crossing Trade Center, be in the left lane and take the next left turn which is Citrus Road. You will see an Enterprise Car Rental lot in front of you. Turn right into the driveway just past Enterprise. You'll see our sign, and you are there. Park, come in and join the fun.
